

## Points of Pride

- 1. For eight consecutive years, U.S. News and World Report has ranked Claflin University among the Top 10 HBCUs (2019 Ranking #7). Claflin University is also one of only four South Carolina universities/colleges and one of only four HBCUs ranked by U.S. News and World Report as being the "Best National Liberal Arts Institutions."
- 2. Ranked Number 1 among HBCUs by U.S. News and World Report's Short List for annual alumni giving of approximately 50 percent
- 3. The Alice Carson Tisdale Honors College, established in 1994, provides students unique preparation for successful careers after graduation
- **4.** Four S.C. Governor's Professors of the Year and two National Science Foundation Early Career Development Faculty Awards since 1996
- 5. Prestigious academic scholarship designations: Fulbright U.S. Student Program (2008), Marshall Scholarship, The Harry S. Truman Scholarship (2014) and the ESB Luard Morse Scholarship (2019)
- **6.** Exceeded \$100 million Capital Campaign goal raising more than \$105 million making it the largest fundraising campaign in Claflin's history
- 7. Selected as a frontier set network institution by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to pursue transformational change in higher education
- 8. The Jonas T. Kennedy Health and Wellness Complex which provides holistic health, nutrition, and lifelong wellness education to the Claflin University campus community and area residents
- **9.** The Henry N. Tisdale Molecular Science Research Center (MSRC) designated a core research facility by the South Carolina Research Authority
- 10. The James and Dorothy Z. Elmore Chapel which serves as a place for worship and educational building for those students who are studying religion and philosophy as well as humanities and social sciences. This crown jewel of the campus was erected debt free.
